SUBJECT: Historical Summary of 574th Personnel
Service Company for Calendar Year 1974

1. The following information is submitted as a supplement to the unit history of the 574th Personnel Service Company for calendar year 1974.
2. The 574th Personnel Service Company was activated on 21 December 1965 under TOE 12-67E and assigned to the 7th Army Support Command. The unit was established to provide consolidated personnel and ADP support to non-divisional units under the PERMACAP system. In 1973, the 574th FSC was transferred from V Corps control to USAREUR as the Regional Personnel Center, Hanau. The unit is currently organized under TOE 12-066101 with an authorized operational strength of seven commissioned officers, five warrant officers and 202 enlisted men. The unit was under the command of Major Donald G. Hall from 18 July 1972 through 29 July 1974 when he was succeeded by the present commander Major J.R. Hardison, Jr.
3. On 14 January 1974, this unit was attached to 130th Engineer Bde for administrative, logistic and funding support by V Corps GO#8, and for Special and Summary Court Martial Jurisdiction on 1 July 1974 by 3d Armd Div GO#227. USAREUR GO#6880 dated 4 September 1974 redesignated the "US Army Regional Personnel and Administrative Center" (ARPAAC) as the "USA Regional Personnel Center"(RPC, Hanau).
4. This unit was honored on 17 August 1974 by a visit from MG Forester, CMT of the USA Institute of Administration and CCL Oliver, CMT of the AG School. Both visitors indicated that they were impressed and commended the mission performance of the unit.
5. In sports activities, the unit participated in all Community Sports activities. The unit won the community volleyball championship and

finished 2d in the V Corps competitions. The basketball team finished in 2d Place in the Community Tournament. Civil and Community activities in 1974 were high-lighted by contributions of \$1,862.00 to the Hanau Community Combined Federal Campaign. During the Christmas Holidays, an additional 600DM were contributed to a local orphanage, the Albert Schweitzer Kinderdorf. A major Project Partnership Activity was the qualification of five members of the company on each of the standard German Army individual and crew served weapons. After their qualification, they were presented with the "Schertzenschur mit Bronze Plakette" (Marksmanship Arquilette with Bronze Medallion) by LTC Prezewlokov of the Bundeswehr Reserves in Hanau.

6. On 1 November 1974, the Administrative Machine Division began providing PERMACAP support for 93 additional units transferred from the RPC in Darmstadt. By January of 1975, this unit was providing this support for 20,691 SM's. One of the greatest achievements of the year was the out processing of more than 600 SM's during the two and one half weeks of "Christmas Drop". This hard work and desire to serve resulted in more than 600 SM's celebrating the Christmas Holidays at home with their families. The unit accomplished one of its training objectives by qualifying every member with the M16A-1 rifle, and testing Protective Masks from 12 - 13 November 1974. The unit also achieved a first by reenlisting one of its members at the Burbach range.
